

### Parents as Partners Portfolio Presentations- Update

After discussing some feedback with staff and families, it has been decided to move the *PAP Student Portfolio Presentations* to **Monday 3rd October** (Term 4, Week 1). This will have the following benefits:

- reducing the number of pupil free days this term from 4 to 3
  - the focus of the PAP in early term 4 will enable conversations with families and students around setting goals for the term
- Portfolios will include-
- 1 **writing** piece to discuss their **next learning goal for term 4**
  - 1 **reading** piece to discuss their **next learning goal for term 4**
  - 1 **numeracy** piece to discuss their **next learning goal for term 4**
  - 1 student free choice

We will not 'double up' by sending portfolios home before the PAP meetings so students can take them home after their PAP meeting.

Teachers will take some notes to record student's next steps.

Like all new processes, we continue to listen to feedback and 'tweak' this process to ensure this is a worthwhile process for teachers, families and students.

### Traffic Safety

A reminder to families to be vigilant in complying with our school drop off and pick up processes. We have noticed some incidents of very unsafe behaviour during pick up time and **remind you that-**

- ✓ Students and families **must** use the school crossing to access the car park
- ✓ Students being picked up near the cricket oval **must** wait and be picked up only between the two orange cones (it is too dangerous for families to ask students to cross the road adjacent to the cricket oval or near the rear sheds)
- ✓ Students being picked up on Seventeenth Street must wait in an authorised zone and not block entry to the bus stop
