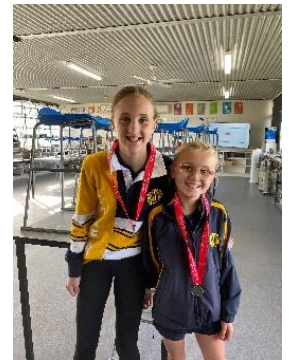

3/4D Numeracy News

In 3/4D, we have started the Term learning about money and financial maths. So far, we have learnt;

- The history of money, what coins are made of and the people on it
- How to calculate change using addition and subtraction
- How an economy works

This week our classroom played 'Mathopoly, which is like a game of traditional Monopoly, but with a twist. It focussed on calculating change. Below are some pictures of us playing Mathopoly.





During Term 4 Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships classes, students in Prep to Grade two and Grades five and six will be learning about understanding the word gender and actions we can take to create positive relationships. We refer to gender as describing the characteristics of girls and boys, women and men that are shaped by our culture, traditions and history, and the way that societies organise what boys and girls, men and women are expected to do. This includes things like the way people are expected to dress and behave. Gender roles and expectations are learned, can change over time, and can vary from culture to culture.

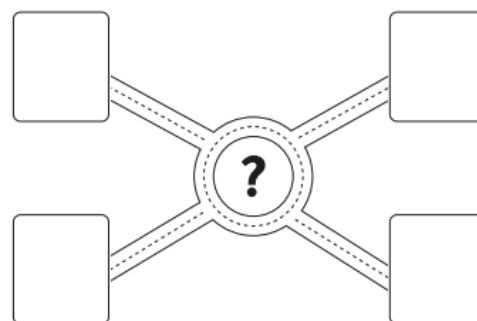


Students in Grades three and four are learning about what a problem is and strategies to use to help them decide about what would be a good solution to the problem. Our first strategy is the Roads and Roundabouts model for problem solving. The roundabout being the place where you are when you are going around and around with a problem, trying to work out which is the right road to take. Before we work out which road to take, we want to know what solution it leads us to! We imagine what might be the good and the bad sides or the positives and negatives for each of the destinations. Ask your child about it.
