Our wonderful classroom artwork raised \$1900 at auction.



## Banana Muffins

### Ingredients

- 2 1/2 cups self-raising flour
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup milk
- 1 egg
- 2 tbs margarine
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 ripe bananas
