NAPLAN National Results

On Monday, the DET announced the NAPLAN National Results. Please find below a summary of this communication.

"The Department of Education and Training has analysed the results for Victoria, and found that Victorian students have achieved some of our highest results ever, maintaining our place as one of the highest performing jurisdictions, along with NSW and ACT.

For example, in 2022, Victorian Year 3 students achieved their best ever Reading results and were again the strongest readers in the country.

Indeed, Victorian students performed particularly strongly at the primary level, with Victoria ranked first or second on eight out of 10 NAPLAN assessments, including all five assessments at Year 3.

Thank you for all your support and all the work that you do to help us ensure that our school, and Victoria as a whole, is one of the best places for children to learn".

Congratulations to all our year 3 and 5 students who participated and gave their best for the NAPLAN assessment this year!

SUCCESS



This week's school value is 'SUCCESS'. Our displayed dispositions around the school suggest that 'Success' involves – doing your best, aiming to achieve your full potential, setting achievable goals and celebrating your successes. Celebrating your successes is an interesting one as some of us, including myself, encourage our own children to remain humble and to not boast when they achieve great things. However, celebrating our successes (without showing-off) is an important part along the developmental journey and something that often inspires us to strive hard and push on.

Teachers play an important role in assisting students to celebrate their individual successes. This is done through: verbal praise; writing notes; sharing the news with family; class incentives; displaying work in the classroom; awards and so on. Often, the biggest highlight of my day is when students proudly walk into my office to show me their work. I love making a fuss of their efforts and hope that my occasionally 'over-the-top' reactions inspire students to strive to achieve more than they thought possible.

Celebrations and acknowledgement make hard work worthwhile, especially because it makes students feel that their efforts are appreciated and valued. Success doesn't always come easy, and children often encounter challenges and setbacks on the way. How can you, your child's biggest fans, celebrate school success at home?

You may like to try these three things –

- ❖ **Words of encouragement and affirmation** - Speaking words of encouragement and affirmation is a great way to celebrate your child's success and build their confidence. For example, if your child has a big presentation coming up, offer encouraging words beforehand and follow up with them afterward. No matter what the outcome, commend them for getting through it. Students should know that academic achievement doesn't only mean getting a high score in a test.
- ❖ **Create new traditions** - Celebrating as a family with fun traditions is a great way to make your child feel recognised. Things like having a special dinner or doing a fun activity of their choice are great examples of traditions your family can put in place. Rather than doing these traditions every time your child receives a certificate or completes a big project, create traditions to commemorate the start and the end of the school year. By doing so, you celebrate their learning experience as a whole.
- ❖ **Celebrate the process, not just the product** - One of the best ways to celebrate your student's success is to have an active role in their education and applaud smaller accomplishments throughout the learning process. Schools will often take time at the beginning of the year for students to journal their goals and establish the steps to achieve them. Make sure you are well informed on your child's academic goals for the year. This way, you can celebrate when they have accomplished a small step towards achieving their overall objective.
