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Understanding Bullying

This year, we had 22% of families complete the Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey. It is interesting to note the following responses to bullying –

- My child feels safe at school – 89% positive
- My child feels confident about the skills and strategies they have learnt at school to address bullying behaviours – 64% positive
- My child has been bullied recently at school – 59% positive

There is a new nationally agreed definition of bullying which all Australian schools now use – Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening.

At The Lake Primary School, we feel as though our students, in general, have a fairly accurate understanding of what bullying is and what bullying is not. It is worth noting that, although they might be unpleasant or distressing, the following examples are not forms of bullying:

- mutual conflict that involves a disagreement, but not an imbalance of power
- single episode acts of nastiness or physical aggression
- social rejection or dislike is not bullying unless it involves deliberate and repeated attempts to cause distress, exclude or create dislike by others.

Our involvement, this year, in The Stand-Up Project (SUP) has focused on empowering students to be upstanders, both out in the playground and in the classroom. We have had multiple occasions throughout the year where students have found the courage to speak up and protect others – this is something that we are constantly encouraging and are striving to build on each day. Like always, if you have suspicions that your child is being bullied, please reach out to your child's classroom teacher as the first point of contact.

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5/6B NEWS

In Year 5/6B, students have been learning how to solve subtraction problems accurately by checking their working and identifying common errors. We've been focusing on using efficient written strategies, estimating to see if answers are reasonable, and explaining why an equation may be incorrect.

Students are getting better at spotting mistakes by using what they know about place value and efficient subtraction strategies. They can recognise when regrouping hasn't been done properly or when numbers have been mixed up, and they're learning to explain their thinking clearly as they fix the equation.

To build accuracy, students have been practising finding errors in a completed equation and then solving it correctly. This helps them think critically about their own calculations and strengthens their understanding of number relationships.

Try this at home!

Find the error in this equation:

$$4\ 672 - 1\ 958 = 3\ 014$$


Where did the mistake happen, and what is the correct answer?
