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Resilience and a positive attitude – Class groupings for 2026

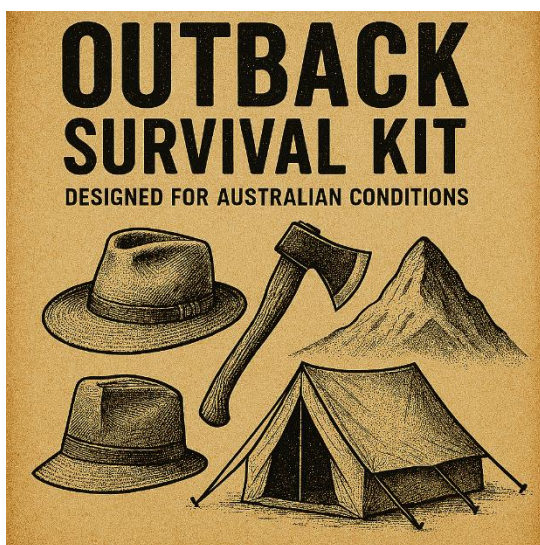

GARDENING GROUP NEWS



The Garden Club have been kept busy in the last few weeks with the on-going weeding chore, which the chooks have enjoyed, and there has been the reward of fresh strawberries to pick and taste too! Our zucchinis are coming along well, and cucumber and tomato plants are looking good. Mr Trev has continued to sprinkle coffee grounds around the strawberry plants to deter the bugs, and this seems to be working.



Last week we started our seed-saving activity, with students picking *Cornflowers* and *Love-in-a-Mist* (*Nigella*). Students were very interested to see the progress of *Nigella* from flower through the start of seed growth to result in a seed pod that doubled as a maraca! Our *Nigella* plants have now been renamed "Maracas"! We opened some green pods to see the seeds forming; and we also shook some seeds from the dried 'maraca pods' so the students could see how the seed pod would act in nature to enable the plant to create its next generation. It was great to see the students so engaged. Mrs Fowler will look after the collected seed over the break ready for students to do the next process of sorting and packing in the new year.



Mrs Fowler is also looking after some native plants we will plant out in the Pedal and Putt area when we have the irrigation installed – more on that next year!

Before we finish the term we will be potting up some strawberry runners, collecting some more seeds including *Cosmos* and *Marigold*, maintaining the weeding and of course enjoying some more strawberries. I have loved being involved with Garden Club this year, and the school gardens in general, and have promised Mr Trev I'll keep an eye on things over the break. Thank so much for the opportunity to come and play in your gardens 😊

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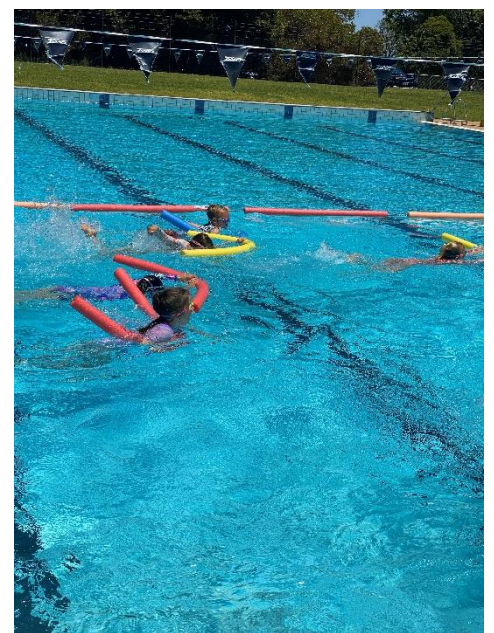
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SWIMMING CARNIVAL
