#### Lourning

This year we have had a significant whole-school focus on writing with many activities to enhance the leve and skill development of writing lag, grammer & punctuation, stamins, vocabulary & sudience|| Students enjoyed writing about the 'mysterious rock' that landed on our oval and scaling to Lake Hewthorn to encourage descriptive writing. Some of our preps were even awarded a price at the Mildura Show for their handwriting)

Congretulations to students who have been a reading 'champ' this year! it was wonderful to see so many students involved in the 'Ms Warburton's Home Reading Challenge', who demonstrated fantastic commitment to read every night. The skill development associated with regular reading is always evident in student learning progress. Having the Book Feir back this year was also a big highlight and opportunity for students to purchase books to take home for their reading enjoyment.

The intervention program this year has once again provided specific and targeted support for students across the Prep to Year 4 cohort. Whether it be perticipation of a few weeks or a term, students have benefited from this small group focus to further develop their literacy and numeracy skills. This year the High Abilities Program provided some challenging thinking and problem-activing lessons which were highly enjoyed by students who participated in the literacy and/or numeracy program. Well done students!

#### Montal Health & Wellbeing

This year, our achool focused on improving the sense of confidence of students being a 'good learner', by looking at, and discussing dispositions and words to describe what this looked like at The Lake and incorporating our achool values to reflect this. To further extend the conversations, all students and families have participated in the design of a school muscot and what it means to be a 'Laker'! The creativity, thoughtful conversations and muscot designs were very impressive! We will continue to further refine this process and look forward to having this concept completed early next year.

Students also enjoyed the Annual Walibeing Week this year (Wackadoo It's Walibeing Week!) and participated in some fun mental health and walibeing focused activities. As always, we aim to provide a high level of support for mental health and walibeing across our school that is facilitated through morning check-ins, chatting with our Walibeing Co-ordinator, across to specific programs butch as R.A.G.I) to ensure students are 'ready to learn' at their optimal best. We closely monitor and act on areas of concern that pop-up in student surveys and calabrate areas of strength and growth in this space. We have also been very fortunate to be part of the Mental Health in Primary Schools Pilot Program this year which has provided another level of support for our families and students. It is fantastic that this program will run again in 2028 Students thoroughly enjoyed the return of school camps this year which further enhanced recilience and social connections. ©

#### Student Engagement

Efforts to promote social and emotional skills and positive gender norms in children has been shown to improve health related outcomes and subjective wellbeing. It also reduces antisocial behaviours including engagement in gender-related violence. The learning materials cover eight topics of Social and Emotional Learning across all levels: Emotional Literacy; Personal Strengths; Positive Coping; Problem Solving; Stress Management; Help Seeking; Gender and Identity; and Positive Gender Relationships.
