Another exciting year has slipped by and it gives me great pleasure to welcome you to our 2011 School Magazine. This year's glossy production has been expertly printed by local firm Sunnyland Press. My congratulations to Mrs Bacon, Ms McNair, staff and students for their outstanding contributions to ensure that this highly valued keepsake has been produced in time for the end of the 2011 school year.

What an exciting and eventful school year it has been! The students, staff and parents watched in anticipation as the \$1.35 million BER/BST building project was completed in the final weeks of Term 1. My sincere thanks to Duncan Pye and his team at CICG for all their support and building expertise. The funding involved \$500,000 from the State Government as part of the 'Better Schools Today' initiative and an \$850,000 Federal grant as part of the 'Building the Educational Revolution' funding. An official 'Recognition Ceremony' was conducted in the first week of Term 2. School Leaders, Stephanie, Tye, Cal, Brittany and Emily were magnificent coordinators of this community event and impressed all visitors and community members with their poise, confidence and maturity. The 5/6 students re-located into their new modern classrooms in the final week of Term 1 and as the year has progressed the value of the flexible learning spaces and new Interactive whiteboards has been enormous and greatly enhanced the educational opportunities for all students. New shade sails in the Term 2 vacation completed the impressive building project.

At the commencement of the new school year we welcomed an influx of new teachers to our school. Mrs. Jackie Walsh, (Leading Teacher & Yr 6) Mrs. Merryn Zeppel (Prep), Miss Amanda Moulds (Yr 2) and Miss Cara Aghan (Yr 5). Long serving teacher Mrs. Teresa Jordan retired after outstanding service to The Lake Primary School and was replaced by Mr. Matthew Baker in Yr 4 at the start of Term 2. Mrs. Robyn Bacon continued her capable efforts in her role of Business Manager. Once again Miss Toni Hamence provided super support in a variety of important roles including spearheading another successful Mildura Eisteddfod choir campaign with our 3/4 choir claiming first place and our 5/6 choir gaining a commendable second place. Mrs. Kristen Wade moved into a shared Prep teaching role with Ms Georgia McNair and really enjoyed the new challenge after many years as a Physical Education Specialist. Mr. Carl Field capably stepped into the Acting Principal role for 5 weeks in Term 2 and thoroughly enjoyed the leadership opportunity. Ms Tracy Kerridge provided sterling support for our allergy students. Ms Georgia McNair worked diligently to coordinate the JSC, School Magazine, Mildura Show art entries, student calendars to name a few of her important roles. Mrs. Marg Eckert has conducted highly worthwhile Reading Recovery and Indonesian programs. Mrs. Jackie Walsh provided enormous support to the teachers as our Literacy Coach and superb leadership in the Leading Teacher role. We were very fortunate to have the services of Mrs. Melissa Kelly in Yr 6 each Thursday.

Congratulations to our students who excelled throughout 2011. Highlights included our school achieving first place in the Merbein District Cluster Athletics Sports. My thanks to Mrs. Trudi Dunbar for her efforts in teaching Physical Education in Term 3. Trudi was also instrumental in skilling up our P-6 students in bush dancing which culminated in a Community Bush Dance in the final week of Term 3. This year's 'Welcome Evening' incorporated 'The Lakes Got Talent' Variety Concert which was extremely popular with students and was supported by a large and appreciative audience. The Year 5/6s enjoyed a fabulous 5 day Major Trip to Canberra and Year 3/4 students visited Swan Hill and enjoyed the educational value provided by the Pioneer Settlement. Tennis Coaching, Instrumental Music sessions involving guitar, drums and keyboard opportunities were available. The JSC students organised a number of student fundraisers with the after school discos proving to be very popular! Grandparents' Morning attracted over 100 grandparents which was an amazing level of support. Tree Planting, Allergy Awareness Week and Indonesian, Book Week Celebrations and NAIDOC Activity mornings were fun events for our students.

My thanks to the supportive Parents Club who have been very active in their fundraising efforts. The inaugural Lake School Ball at the Settlers Club raised \$7,000 which was allocated to an exciting new playground equipment project in Term 4. Our School Council continues to provide fantastic support and direction for our school.

Finally my sincere thanks to all students, staff and parents for their valued contributions to another successful year for our school. Best wishes to our Year 6s as they move onto the next stage of their educational journey. A big thank-you to families who may also be leaving our school community. With increased enrolments in 2012, including over 40 Preps, our future is looking very positive and we look forward to continuing to share the educational partnership and *'Sail towards Success.'*
