

### **Major Fundraiser – October 24<sup>th</sup>**

What an amazing night! Our community night certainly was a wonderful display of what it means to be part of a supportive and inclusive community. Equally important, was the amazing opportunity for our students to play and interact with students of all ages! Through the generous support of our entire community, a remarkable \$7,630 was raised which was instrumental in helping us raise essential funds for our STEM and Art programs.

### **Pedal & Putt**



It's remarkable what can be achieved with the passion, dedication and once again, the very generous donations from our local community that contributed to this initiative! A big thank you to all involved! The students are very proud and excited to have this adventure track at our school!

### **Linked In Lakers Initiative**

We proudly introduced our Linked in Lakers initiative this year, aimed at strengthening connections between students and staff. This initiative has already fostered a deeper connection with our students and it's been a wonderful opportunity to support for our students' growth; both academically and socially.

### **Purchase of a 39-Seater Bus**

The purchase of a new 39-seater bus has already provided greater opportunities for off-site learning experiences, such as camps, local excursions, swimming lessons, sporting events and so much more! It is wonderful to be able to give our students these wonderful hands-on experiences in their own community!





### **Stomp**

The Stomp event was a standout moment in our school calendar, showcasing our students' incredible talents, creativity & teamwork. This was a celebration that many of our families came to see and support our performers.

### **Real Schools**

Our partnership with Real Schools continues to thrive, focusing on improving our school culture and fostering positive relationships among students and staff. This initiative continues to create a supportive and engaging learning environment based on a united vision for whole-school culture!

### **Glasses for Kids Program**

The Glasses for Kids Program was fully supported by our families and it was a wonderful opportunity which ensured that all students have access to glasses if needed. This initiative demonstrated our commitment to the well-being and success of every child in our school.

### **NAPLAN**

This year, our school achieved commendable results, with 83% of Year 3 students meeting writing standards, surpassing the state average of 80%. In other areas, our Year 3 students demonstrated solid performance in numeracy (77%) and grammar and punctuation (63%), while reading (63%) and spelling (57%) showed room for improvement compared to state averages.

This year, our school recorded strong results with 74% of Year 5 students meeting reading standards, slightly above the state average of 75%. While we achieved 66% in writing and 65% in numeracy, areas like spelling (58%) and grammar and punctuation (56%) indicate opportunities for further improvement compared to state benchmarks.

Thank you for your ongoing support and dedication to The Lake PS. Here's to another successful year ahead in 2026!

# ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL REPORT

Wow! What another extraordinary year at The Lake Primary School! Our students have continued to amaze us with their growing independent learning habits, their eagerness to tackle new challenges and their desire to be their best selves.

With the introduction of FISO 2.0 (Framework for Improving Student Outcomes), we have seen an increased emphasis on student wellbeing. In fact, learning (50%) and wellbeing (50%) now hold equal weighting within schools. This year, we have set lofty targets around a) teacher concern; b) sense of connectedness; c) bullying; d) sense of inclusion; and e) sense of confidence. To address these wellbeing targets, we have remained focussed on our restorative practices within our Real Schools framework along with introducing two new initiatives – Linked In Lakers and The Stand-Up Project.

Linked In Lakers has been aimed at addressing connectedness. Each staff member has been a supportive mentor for approximately 10 students by checking-in regularly, being available to listen or simply just having a ‘walk and talk’. The Stand-Up Project has focussed on strengthening student voice and giving students the encouragement and permission to be an upstander. I would like to congratulate and thank the 23 senior students who have driven this new initiative with passion and a real sense of responsibility. I look forward to assisting the students to build on the momentum next year.

Our buildings and grounds have continued to be a great source of pride for our school community and we are the envy of many. Mr. Trev Roelofs, our full-time groundsman, has continued to pour his heart and soul into a variety of projects, with the most recent one being an expansive outdoor play space for the students. On October 24<sup>th</sup>, we held our major fundraiser, which included the grand opening of our new bike track and golf chipping green, which has been aptly named, ‘Lakers’ Pedal & Putt’. This innovative new play space will further encourage physical activity amongst our students, provide lots of opportunities to laugh together and build relationships. Oh, how lucky we all are!

Finally, thank you to our wonderful school community for your enthusiastic support throughout the year. Our list of volunteers continues to grow and your input, both big and small, makes a significant contribution to The Lake Primary School family.




2025 Children's Book Week was celebrated 16-23 August.


The theme was 'Book an Adventure' and marked the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary since its inception.


# ANZAC SERVICE
