Kids' Cooking

Banana Muffins

Ingredients

- 2 1/2 cups self-raising flour
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup milk
- 1 egg
- 2 tbs margarine
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 ripe bananas



Equipment

1 12-hole muffin pan

Method

- STEP 1 Combine milk, egg, margarine, vanilla and bananas and blend in a mixing jug.
- STEP 2 Place flour and sugar in a large bowl. Mix in milk mixture.
- STEP 3 Pour mixture into a greased muffin tray.
- STEP 4 Bake for 20-25 minutes at 180c.

Pita Snack

Ingredients

- 1 small pita bread
- 2 teaspoons tomato paste or chutney
- 1 slice Swiss Cheese
- 2 slices of ham
- 1 teaspoon chopped spring onion

Method

- 1. Put pita bread on plate.
- 2. Spread with tomato paste or chutney.
- 3. Add cheese slice.
- 4. Chop ham and put on top.
- 5. Sprinkle onion on top.
- 6. Cook in microwave on high for 30 seconds.

- 2 long crusty bread rolls
- 2 tablespoons garlic butter

Can of spaghetti

- 2 thick slices Devon or ham
- 2 slices processed cheese



Method

- 1. Heat oven to 180c. Lightly grease oven tray.
- Cut rolls in half lengthways and spread with butter.
- 3. Put rolls on tray.
- 4. Spoon spaghetti onto each roll.
- Chop meat and sprinkle over spaghetti.
- 6. Cut cheese in strips and cross over rolls.
- 7. Bake for 12 minutes. Serve hot.

Macaroni Bake

- 1 1/2 cups of small macaroni
- 1 big pan of boiling water
- 4-6 slices of ham
- 1 onion peeled and chopped
- 1x440g can of tomato soup
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 cup grated cheese

Method

- Drop macaroni into pot of boiling water.
- 2. Keep it boiling well for 8 minutes.
- 3. Drain well and put into 8 cup casserole dish.
- 4. Chop ham and stir into casserole.
- 5. Stir in soup, milk and cheese.
- 6. Bake for 45 minutes on 190c.
- 7. Serve hot with a tossed salad and French Bread.


