
My favourite part of the day was meeting other people from different schools and getting to know them and when the Loud Noises team came on stage.


SUPERHEROES

- **Getting help when needed**








Our wonderful classroom artwork raised \$1900 at auction.



Banana Muffins

Ingredients

- 2 1/2 cups self-raising flour
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup milk
- 1 egg
- 2 tbs margarine
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 ripe bananas



Equipment

1 12-hole muffin pan

Method

- STEP 1 Combine milk, egg, margarine, vanilla and bananas and blend in a mixing jug.
- STEP 2 Place flour and sugar in a large bowl. Mix in milk mixture.
- STEP 3 Pour mixture into a greased muffin tray.
- STEP 4 Bake for 20-25 minutes at 180c.

Method

1. Put pita bread on plate.

5. Sprinkle onion on top.
6. Cook in microwave on high for 30 seconds.

7. Bake for 12 minutes. Serve hot.

Macaroni Bake

1 1/2 cups of small macaroni
1 big pan of boiling water
4–6 slices of ham
1 onion peeled and chopped
1x440g can of tomato soup
1/2 cup milk
1 cup grated cheese

Method

1. Drop macaroni into pot of boiling water.
2. Keep it boiling well for 8 minutes.
3. Drain well and put into 8 cup casserole dish.
4. Chop ham and stir into casserole.
5. Stir in soup, milk and cheese.
6. Bake for 45 minutes on 190c.
7. Serve hot with a tossed salad and French Bread.
