A total of \$7,500 was raised to go towards major projects within the school to benefit our students.





















APPLE CAR RACERS

Ingredients:



4 apples, 16 green grapes, cut in half. You will also need:16 tooth-picks .

 Gather all ingredients. Cut two full cheeks from each apple. Slice out the centre third so you have a wedge.



 Slip 2 toothpicks into each apple wedge to become the car axles. Place grape halves on each side of the toothpick for wheels.

Vroom Vroom!

Ingredients:

- 1 tbs icing sugar
- 1 tsp water
- 1/4 cup choc chips
- 1/3 cup white chocolate melts
- 1/4 cup butter
- 4 cups marshmallows
- 2 tsp green food colouring
- 5 cups Rice Bubbles
- 1/4 cup sprinkles
- 1/4 cup raspberry licorice pieces

Method

- 1. Mix a tablespoon of icing sugar and a little water in a snap lock bag. Add more sugar or water until you have a small amount of thick icing. Cut off the corner of the bag ready to use as a piping bag. Use the icing to 'glue' a small choc chip to the centre of the large white chocolate melts to make eyes.
- 2. Melt the butter in a large saucepan over a low heat. Add the marshmallows and stir until they are melted and mixed well. Cook the mixture for a further minute or two, stirring constantly, then remove from the heat. Add 6-12 drops of food colouring (depending on how green you want your monsters to be) and stir until the entire mixture turns bright green! Add the rice bubbles and mix well until everything is combined.
- 3. While the mixture cools off a little, set out some cupcake liners and all your decorations ready to go.
- 4. Using two spoons, shape spoonfuls of the Rice Bubble mixture into rough balls and pop them into the cupcake liners. (You can use your hands if you like but it will get very sticky, very quickly!) Decorate your monsters with sprinkles, eyes and a mouth.
- 5.Pop your monster Rice Bubble treats into the fridge for a little while until they set, then enjoy a monstrous treat!

TINY TEDDY TRAINS

Ingredients:

- 100g chocolate, melted
- 1 x 340g family size pkt Smarties
- 12 x 25g Milky Way Bars
- 1 x 200g pkt Licorice Allsorts
- 1 x 180g Licorice Sticks
- 1 x 250g box Tiny Teddies

Method:

- 1. Using the melted chocolate as 'glue', stick 2 Smarties on each side of the Milky Way Bar for the wheels.
- 2. Glue one 1/2 square of Licorice Allsorts onto the top of the Milky Way.
- 3. Cut a Tiny Teddy off at the waist and glue onto the top of the train.
- 4. Cut a Licorice Stick in half crossways and glue on the front of the train as the steam spout.

Ingredients:


- 1/2 cup salt

- STEP 1: Mix all ingredients together in a medium sized saucepan.
- STEP 2: Stir over heat until dough is pliable.
- STEP 3: Allow to cool and store in a well sealed plastic bag or container.

Notes: 3 drops of colouring is an estimate - please adjust to your liking. This makes enough for 2-4 children to have a good sized lump to play with. I keep it in the fridge and it lasts for 6 months or more.


