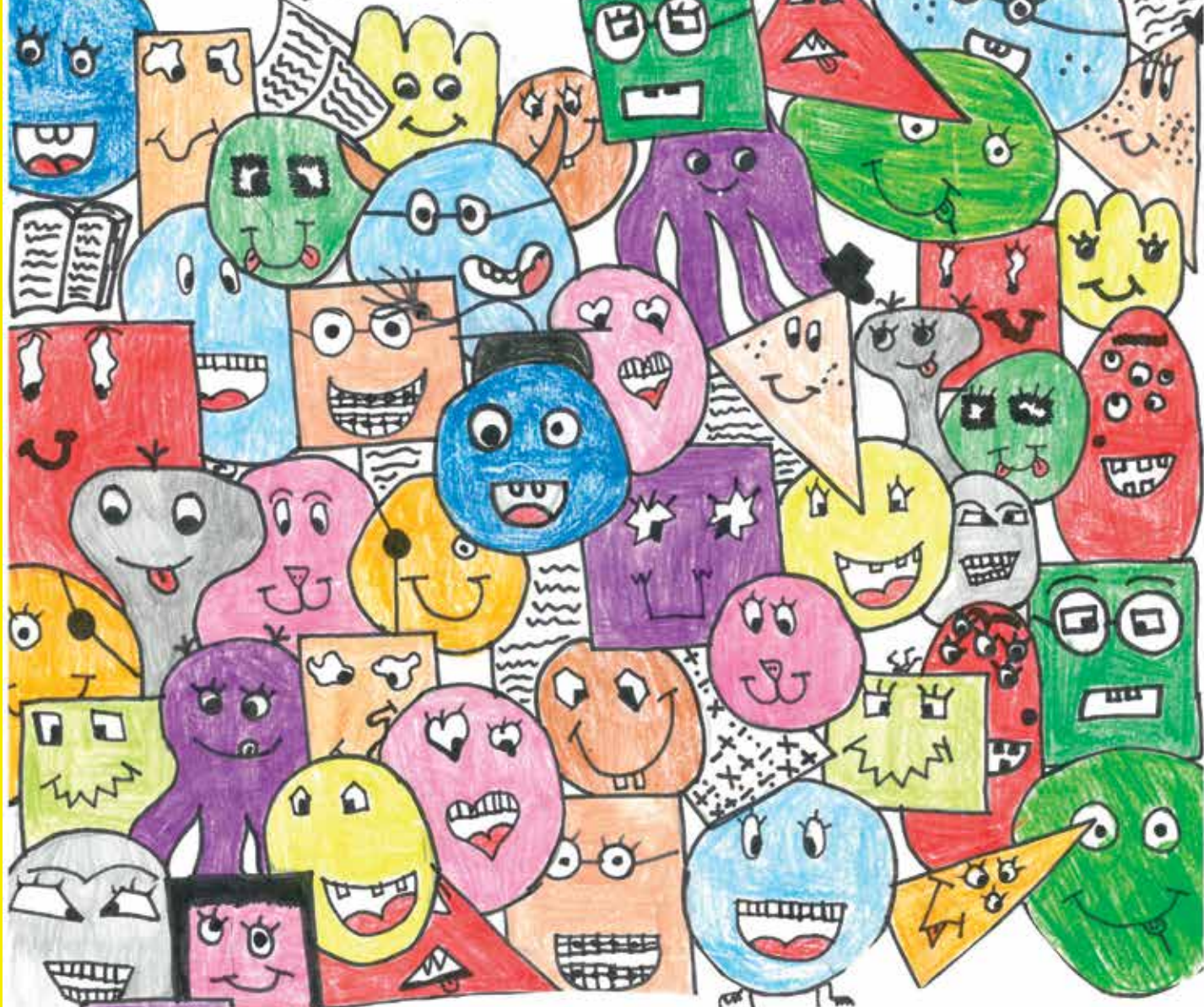

Mr Shaun McInerney arrived as our first assistant principal and has made a big impact supporting students, staff and parents and collaborating at a leadership level to provide me with wonderful support. Congratulations to all staff members for their dedicated professional contributions. My thanks to my two leading teachers, Mr Parsons and Mrs Walsh, for their valued support, leadership and coaching expertise in their respective numeracy and literacy roles. Our students excelled at Physical Education and a number competed strongly in regional and state finals.

Junior School Council was coordinated by Ms McNair and Ms Goddard with assistance from Mr McInerney. School Council was once again an active and supportive group led by our dedicated president Damien Simonetta. The P & C Group under the capable leadership of president Karalee Brice, once again achieved some terrific fundraising outcomes and provided valued support for students and staff.

Assistant Principal's Page—Shaun McInerney

Moving to The Lake Primary School at the beginning of last year was a very considered decision. I had spent seven years at my previous school and had established a strong connection with the students, staff and broader community. Initially, I was reluctant to leave. I was also acutely aware of the very healthy reputation of The Lake Primary School shared collectively by the Sunraysia community. Twelve months into my time here, I can honestly say my decision has been validated.



My first impressions of The Lake Primary School were extremely positive. Immediately, I was taken by the unmatched community support and the friendly welcome of staff, students and families. I was blown away to witness the huge gathering at the End of Year Concert (2016)! As the school year unfolded and I was able to 'dig' deeper into the foundations, I grew excited by the challenge of identifying academic trends and planning intervention strategies to accelerate sustained student growth.

Our standardised data sets, comparatively, have been quite reasonable for consecutive years now, however, at the beginning of this year we identified several areas that we wanted to lift - numeracy, writing and spelling took on a specific focus. With carefully planned internal and external professional development and collaborative partnerships with neighbouring schools, strong progress has been made in 2017. Our 'Relative Growth' data, where students' progress is tracked from Yr.3 to Yr.5, has highlighted a positive trend. Noticeably, a much greater percentage of students are achieving 'high growth'. Our whole-school focus will remain on exploring evidence-based teaching and intervention strategies and a differentiated learning approach to maintain momentum and continue to accelerate individual growth.

At The Lake Primary School, all staff are committed to transparent, three-way correspondence – students, teachers and parents. When one of these key elements resists, or does not fully invest, communication is jeopardised. Schools simply will not thrive on mediocre communication. Our Parent Opinion Survey data for 2017 was particularly encouraging. It is reassuring to know that families appreciate the collective efforts of the teaching and administration body. Excitingly, our student enrolments continue to grow with numbers predicted to reach 300 next year—this is high praise and reflective of the many wonderful initiatives at our school. An increase in numbers presents many challenges. Our collective focus, of course, remains the social, emotional and academic growth of all students.

Exciting times lay ahead at The Lake Primary School and I look forward to continuing to support students, staff, parents and the broader school community in 2018.
