Specialist) and Mrs Donna Fisher (Term 1) and Mrs Louise Bowes (Terms 2-4) in the Primary Welfare Officer role.

Each year we welcome a new, enthusiastic batch of Prep students (55) and new families to our school community. Term 1 commenced in fine style with a highlight being our annual 'Welcome Back Evening' with the students demonstrating their newly acquired dance moves courtesy of the STOMP Dance Academy from Melbourne. The crowd of approximately 650 adults and children really enjoyed the event.

My thanks to all of my exceptional staff members who have combined cohesively throughout the year. Our major focus has been on further developing our Literacy area (Reading). 






Students read 'Spot' books in Italian in **Term 1** and learnt about family members. They played games of memory match and created their very own family trees.

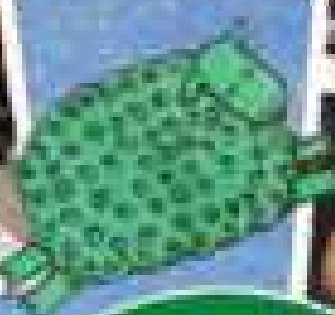


Italian with Year 1/2

In **Term 4** students learnt about Italian animals with the help of the book 'Dear Zoo'. They also danced and sang in preparation for the Italian Fete.

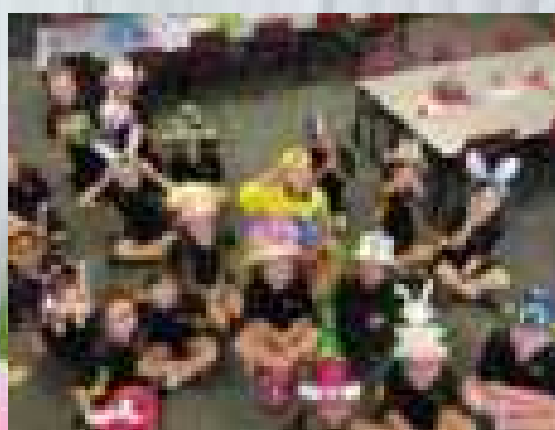
